- **Skill Development**: The NEP aims to bridge the gap between academia and industry by promoting skill development programs. Collaborations between universities and industries will be strengthened to ensure graduates possess the practical skills demanded by the job market, fostering a skilled workforce.
- **Global Exposure**: The policy encourages internationalization of higher education by promoting collaborations, student exchanges, and research partnerships with renowned institutions worldwide. This global exposure will provide students with a broader perspective, cultural understanding, and opportunities for global career prospects.

The implementation of the NEP in the year 2024 in our institution will bring about significant positive changes in the way education is imparted. It will empower learners to become adaptable, innovative, and globally competent individuals, ready to contribute to society and thrive in a rapidly evolving world.

Awareness about NEP 2020:

Satish Pradhan Dnyanasadhana College organized a conclave on "Transforming Higher Education Institutions into the New World of Quality Education via National Education Policy 2020." in collaboration with National Assessment And Accreditation Council (NAAC), Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR), and the University of Mumbai. Due to the huge response, the venue of the conclave shifted from the college premises to the Kashinath Ghanekar Auditorium. It witnessed the participation of esteemed dignitaries, education experts and policy makers.


